Information regarding your trash and recycle cart!

In an effort to keep our communities clean and create more efficient collection routes, your municipality has chosen to stay with the automated trash and recycle collection using carts. The lidded carts keep materials dry and from blowing out on windy days. The carts are also designed to easily roll to the street or road. Further, the automated collection system increases the level of safety for route drivers.

Do I now have a new pick-up schedule and when can I start using my carts?

Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday service days will remain the same. If your pick-up day is Friday your pick-up day will be changing to Thursday. Your first Thursday pickup will be November 4th, 2021.

- (1) 95-gallon trash cart (blue cart with BLACK lid)
- (1) 95-gallon recycling cart (blue cart with GREEN lid)

Can I place my recyclables in plastic bags?

NO, DO NOT place recyclables in plastic bags or put bags-of-bags in your cart. For information on local grocery and retail stores that accept shopping bags and other stretch film plastic for recycling, go to

What should I do if my trash and recycle does not fit in my cart?

- Save them for your next collection day.
- Ask a neighbor if they have extra room in their cart for your trash or recycle.
- Call Harter's to rent an additional trash or recycle cart for a yearly fee.

Can I take my carts with me if I move?

No. Each cart should stay with the property. These carts are the property of Harter's, for cart repair or rental of additional cart; please call (833) 754-2158.

How do I set my cart out on collection day?

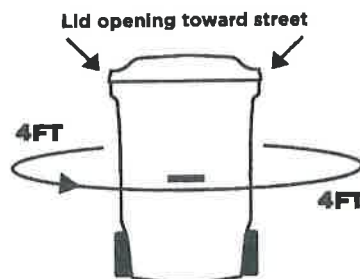
Place your cart curbside before 6 am the day of collection, with the cart's handle facing your house and the lid opening toward the street. All solid waste MUST be bagged. Make sure there is at least four feet between the recycling and trash carts, and any other objects, such as a parked car or mailbox. Note, if your carts were set out late, you must wait until your next scheduled pick-up.

What if there is a snow bank?

In the case of snow, if your cart will not fit in your driveway opening, then you will need to clear an opening in the snow bank where the cart can be properly placed. Carts cannot be placed on top of the snow bank or in the road. Improperly placed carts will not be collected.

How do Holiday's affect my pick-up?

Holiday collection will be delayed one day, if the Holiday is on a weekday before your pick-up day. Holidays are New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day



Curbside Recycling Guidelines

Place recyclables loosely in your bin. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

- Dairy containers & lids
- Produce, bakery & deli containers & lids

- Plastic bags, wrap or film

Some stuff just doesn't belong in your recycling bin...

Plastic bags




Plastic bags, film and wrap are the #1 contaminant. Keep recyclables loose in the bin and take plastic bags back to store drop-offs. See below.

Sharps



Needles, lancets and syringes are the #1 safety concern for sorting staff. Do not throw sharps in recycling or trash. Visit: dnr.wi.gov and search "Sharps Collections".

Yuck



Liquids, food and trash contaminate good recyclables. Empty and rinse containers; compost food scraps and throw trash in the garbage.

Tanglers



Cords, chains and wires wrap around sorting equipment creating unnecessary maintenance. Take these items to e-waste collectors or scrap metal dealers.

Textiles



Clothing, towels and bedding wrap around sorting equipment creating unnecessary maintenance. Donate textiles, or if wet and moldy, throw them in the garbage.

PLASTIC FILM & WRAP...recycle it at participating stores, **NOT in your curbside recycling**

CREATING A CLEANER, HEALTHIER COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENT THROUGH PROPER WASTE HANDLING, REDUCTION, RECYCLING, REUSE. INFORMATION IN THIS BROCHURE IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

The City provides each residential unit **one cart** for refuse and **one cart** for recycling. The City's contractor (Harter's Lakeshore Disposal) will service only one refuse cart each week and one recycling cart every two weeks. The following information will help guide you through the proper way to manage your refuse/waste – the Do's, the Don'ts.

REFUSE - DO'S

- It is optional to place household/kitchen refuse/waste in bags; however, carts will remain cleaner longer if a bag is used and less debris will blow out of the cart when emptied.
- Reduce the amount of refuse/waste you generate
 - buy in bulk when possible
 - use refillable and reusable products
 - by concentrates to reduce packaging
 - use cloth towels and not paper
 - bring your own bags to stores
 - sell or donate used goods such as clothing, furniture and toys to thrift shops, daycares, charity, or secondhand stores
- ashes, sawdust, construction dust, vacuum cleaner dust, etc. should be bagged, sealed, and placed in the refuse cart
- cardboard or paper contaminated by oil, grease, or food shall be placed in the refuse cart
- bulk waste, such as furniture, rolled carpeting, fixtures, lumber, etc. will be collected as long as it fits in the container
- construction waste will be collected provided the resident performed their own work and the materials are placed in the cart and do not prevent the lid from being closed
- paint cans must be in a dry or hardened state, you may add floor-dry or kitty litter
- place your cart on the end of your driveway (in line with the mailbox) and more than 3' from any post, mailbox, recycling cart, or other object. Do not place in the street.
- cart must face the road as indicated by the arrow on the cart
- carts must be fully accessible, 3' apart. they cannot be blocked by parked vehicles or any other object

- all containers must be curbside by **6 AM** on the scheduled collection day, **DO NOT** place your cart out earlier than 7 PM the day prior to pick up or after snow plowing

REFUSE - DON'TS

- **do not place electronics such as TV's, Monitors, Cell Phones, etc in refuse cart**
- do not place recyclables in the refuse cart
- do not place yard waste in the refuse cart
- do not place engine oils, anti-freeze, or any other liquid in the refuse cart
- do not place any batteries, fluorescent tubes /bulbs, or thermostats in the refuse cart
- do not place any hazardous or medical supplies or medications in the refuse cart
- do not place explosive material/ammunition in the refuse cart
- do not place cart in roadway or on snowbanks
- **do not place anything outside the cart – it will not be picked up**

Holiday Refuse/Recycling Collection: If the following holidays fall on a weekday, collection will be one day later after the holiday for the remainder of the week. See the yearly Recycling Calendar. **New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day**



Appliances and Furniture:

Large appliances, microwaves, TV's and stereos in wooden consoles, and large furniture shall be a special pick-up. Call **Ozaukee Iron and Metal at 1-262-284-4060**. This company accepts these items. Try to sell these items first through store postings or ads, or recycle and give to refinishers, second hand/thrift stores, or charities. College students need furniture for their apartments – list free for pick-up at the colleges.



Building Material (major projects):

Debris from major remodeling, construction projects or work done by contractors will not be collected. Removal of this material is the property owner's responsibility. You may call **Ozaukee Iron and Metal (1-262-284-4060)**.



Household Hazardous Waste/ Infectious Waste/Flammable Liquids/Chemicals: Port

Washington Residents may drop off most items at no charge at Veolia Special Services at 1-262-243-8998



Paint and Related Products: Liquid - paint, varnish, stains, thinner/ stripper, etc. will not be collected. Call **Veolia Special Services at 1-262-243-8998**. Open cans of dried or hard paint can be placed in the refuse cart. If the can has a small amount of liquid, use oil dry or kitty litter.



Waste Motor Oil: Waste motor oil may not be placed in the trash container. Oil may be taken to The City Street Department between the months of April - December for no charge (262-284-2600). The **Ozaukee County Highway Department** accepts waste motor oil also, for no charge (262-284-9411).



Cooking Oil: (turkey deep fryer units) Mix oil with floor dry or cat litter until all liquid is absorbed. Store in a double bag, seal, and place in the refuse cart.



Vehicle Batteries: Will not be picked up. Batteries may be dropped off at **Veolia Special Services (1-262-243-8998)** or **Ozaukee Iron and Metal (262-284-4060)**.



Propane/ Gas Containers: will not be collected roadside. **Ozaukee Iron and Metal** accepts them (262-284-4060).



Fluorescent Tube/Bulbs and

Thermostats: will not be collected. Veolia Special Services has a location in Port Washington and will accept them at no cost up to 10 bulbs. 1-262-243-8998. Please place in a sealed double bag in case of breakage.



Auto/Truck Tires:

Will not be collected roadside. Worn tires may be taken to **Tires Unlimited** for a small fee (262-284-4414) or **Ozaukee Iron and Metal (262-284-4060)**.



Brush and Leaf Collection: 2023

Brush is collected bi-weekly from **April 24th – May 22nd**, weekly from **June 5th – August 21st**, and bi-weekly from **September 5th – October 2nd**. All brush must be at the curb on Monday at 7 am, the Street crew will make one trip through the city. Brush will be accepted at the Street Yard from **October 7th – December 2nd**. Brush shall consist of all “woody” material, maximum 8 inches in diameter. Place brush (cut ends with the flow of traffic) at roadside. Brush and logs cut by a contractor must be disposed of by the contractor. Leaves may be raked into the street October 1st – November 26th only, weather permitting. Leaves can be bagged and taken to the Street Yard. PLEASE NOTE: ALL dates are subject to change.

Brush Policy for 2023

Brush piles that are estimated to exceed 15 minutes of chipping will be eligible to be disposed of by “hauling away”. For example, brush in the parkway that is stacked 5 feet high and longer than 15 feet.

It is important to properly stack brush with butt ends facing the curb in the direction of traffic and to separate logs and brush. If possible, stack brush in smaller individual piles that will allow for “grab and go” in order to be carried to the chipper. If eligible for “hauling away” you will be notified with a letter informing you that you will be charged before the work is performed and a bill will be sent. We will do our best to not charge and assist in informing of the proper way to stack brush so we can be more efficient.

The charge rate is \$60 if “hailed away”. All normal chipping is still free. Also, if you have smaller piles that can be put in containers for an example; clear bags, small box, or plastic tubs, it would be much appreciated to make the process more efficient.

Separate logs and brush into two distinct piles for easier pickup. Brush must be placed in the parkway (area between the curb and the sidewalk). **There is absolutely no placing of brush in the road.** For those residents who have smaller terraces or no terraces at all, please place brush in your front yard parallel to the sidewalk. **Also, if you have a contractor remove a tree, direct the contractor to take or chip the branches.**

Brush and Leaf Collection:

Brush collection is made bi-weekly from the week of April 24th to the week of May 22nd, weekly from June 5th to the week of August 21st, and bi-weekly from the week of September 5th to the week of October 2nd. All brush must be at the curb by Monday at 7:00 am. One trip will be made through the City whether it takes 1 day or 5 days. The Street Crew will no longer pick brush from dead end alleys, all other alleys will only be picked up by request by calling city hall at 262-284-2600 ext. 1018 as of 04/01/2023.

Brush will be accepted at the Street Yard from October 7th to December 2nd.

Brush shall consist of all “woody” material, maximum 8 inches in diameter. Place brush (cut ends with the flow of traffic) at roadside. The brush pile should be no higher than 3 feet in height for pick up. Please place small piles of brush and twigs into a container (such as a small clear plastic bag or small box) for a quicker disposal.

Brush and logs cut by a contractor must be disposed of by the contractor.

Leaves may be raked into the street October 1st – November 26th only, weather permitting. Leaves can be bagged and taken to the Street Yard until December 2nd.

Holiday Decorations and Christmas Trees:

Wreaths and garland are considered refuse and are to be placed in the refuse cart. Christmas trees will be collected curbside by the DPW several times in the **month of January.** **Do Not Leave the tree stands, light strings, ornaments, and/ or tree bags on the trees.**

- ✓ Can residents bring down stones –
how much and where? **4 in. and smaller stones - Dirt Pile (No limit)**
- ✓ Can residents bring down bricks – how much and where? **Concrete Pile (No limit)**
- ✓ Can residents bring down patio bricks/stones –
how much and where? **Concrete Pile (No limit)**

- ✓ Can residents bring down gravel – how much and where? **Dirt Pile (No limit)**
- ✓ Can residents bring down regular wood fence material? **No – (Do Not Take)**
- ✓ Can residents bring down landscaping stones –
how much and where? **6 in. or smaller stones – Dirt Pile (No limit)**

White Paper and Cardboard in dumpster – must be flattened before being placed in the dumpster. No Styrofoam in dumpster or plastic bags.

Dumpster for Invasive Species: List of Invasive Species (no bags in dumpster, please dump out your bag out): Garlic Mustard, Yellow Mustard, Dames Rocket, Burdock, and Thistles.

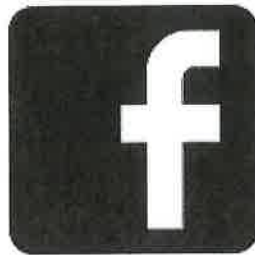

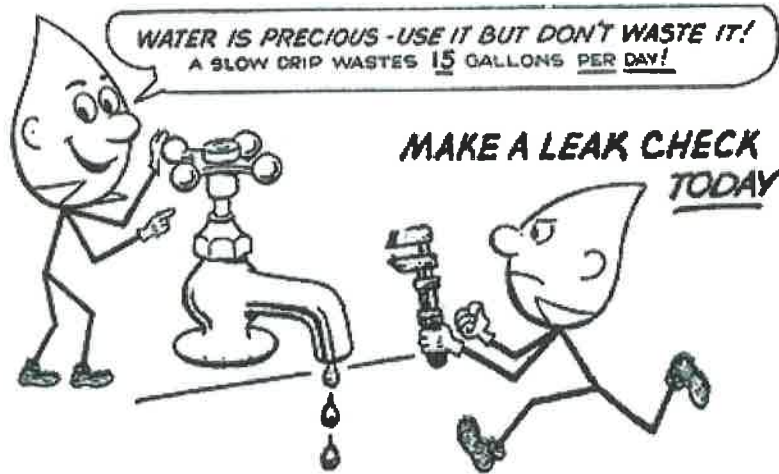

Pay Water Bills



The City of Port Washington issues water/sewer bills every even-numbered month. The bills are postcards. Payment is due by the 25th of each billing month, or the next business day if the due date falls on a weekend or holiday.

Water meters are read every odd-numbered month and billing is based on units of 100 cubic feet (equal to 748 gallons) plus a base rate, currently \$68.46. The sewer usage rate is \$3.30 per cubic feet.

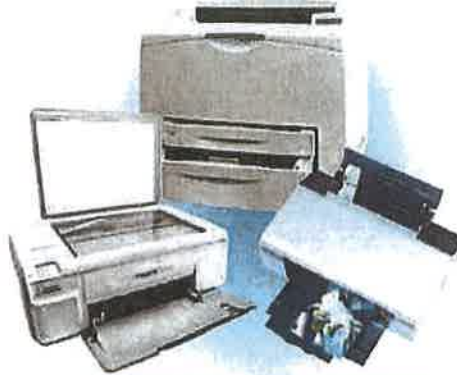

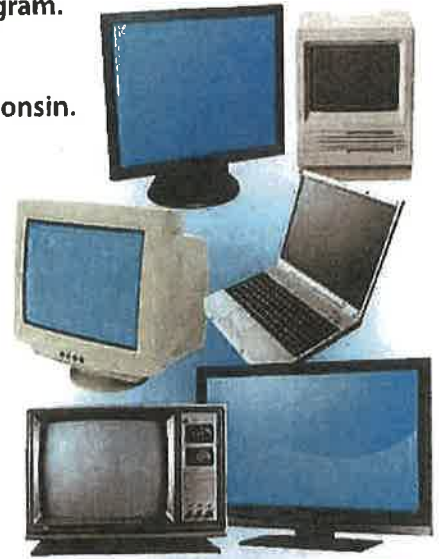

These bans apply no matter where the devices are from or who used them. Wisconsin households, K-12 public schools and Milwaukee Parental Choice Program schools can recycle banned devices (except cell phones) through E-Cycle Wisconsin.
